The Synod 2025 Meeting will begin on Saturday, August 30 and will conclude on Tuesday, September 2.

Synod Meetings commence with an Opening Worship service, which this year will include the installation of a new Moderator, Rev Salesi Faupula.

Synod 2025 will be privileged to have Rev Tara Tauari, General Secretary of Te Hāhi Weteriana o Aotearoa (the Methodist Church of New Zealand) to provide our daily theological reflections. As an esteemed theologian, and proud Māori, Tara will bring a unique perspective to each day's discussions both as someone from outside our Uniting Church and as a First Nations person.

Members will also have the opportunity to attend one of six elective sessions, an educative opportunity providing knowledge and learnings to resource members for their role(s) within congregations, presbyteries and wider Church engagement. Members will also be able to connect more deeply with the Synod reports by attending two deep dive reporting sessions which provide space to engage, explore and ask questions of reporting body achievements, future challenges and opportunities, in a creative and interactive environment.

UCA Assembly Press Release

Joint Statement Uniting Church Assembly, UnitingCare Australia, UnitingWorld and Frontier Services Welcoming the announcement of the 2025 Federal Election and launching Our Vision for a Just Australia

As Australians prepare to head to the federal polls in the coming months, national leaders of the Uniting Church in Australia have joined together to call on voters and decision makers to reflect on the values that shape our communities.

"Elections are vital moments in the life of our nation, an opportunity to advocate for just policies that promote the flourishing of all people," said Rev Charissa Suli, President of the Uniting Church in Australia. "For decades the Uniting Church has been a Christian voice for a compassionate, inclusive and courageous society.

We long to see a nation built not on division, but on compassion; not on power, but on service to the common good." "Standing in this tradition and in the tradition of Jesus Christ, friend of the marginalised, this election campaign we will raise our voice to see fairness, dignity and care for the most vulnerable at the heart of our nation's priorities."

UnitingCare Australia National Director Claerwen Little said that Australians are facing an unprecedented cost-of-living crisis, with financial pressures leaving many households unable to meet basic needs. "The current crisis calls for bold leadership and compassionate policies that prioritise fairness and reflect the type of society we want to be.

This election we're calling for political leaders to ensure every Australian can access a strong safety net in times of need, and be adequately supported by vital frontline community services."

"This much needed investment is not just about addressing today's crisis—it's about building a fairer, stronger Australia for tomorrow," said Ms Little. "As powerful nations retreat from the global fight against poverty and climate change, Australia is at a crossroads," said Dr Sureka Goringe, National Director of UnitingWorld.
